Manufacturing Snapshot

The manufacturing sector in the US has taken several hits in the last 18 months - but as we close out 2021, there are signs of growth and recovery on the horizon.

We've been hearing from Workforce Boards in several states about new programs focused on putting people to work in manufacturing jobs. These careers offer fair wages, benefit packages, job security and many opportunities for growth and advancement. Within the industry, there is a focus on:

- filling current openings in entry and mid-skill level positions;
- preparing workers to take on higher-level roles as Baby Boomers retire in larger numbers;
- creating a more diverse and inclusive workplace environment;
- and building employment and training pathways to prepare American workers for new high-tech, digital manufacturing processes.

Using the Dun & Bradstreet Business Risk and Material Change indicators, we analyzed the nationwide distribution of high and low failure risk of manufacturing businesses by state. These maps illustrate the relative concentrations of high and low risk manufacturing businesses. States with darker shading have higher concentrations of high or low risk manufacturers.


Manufacturing Snapshot (continued)


